What online safety skills does a child need?

You Are More Interesting Than You Think!

- Think Before You Share
- Do Not Share Too Much
- Keep Your Profile at a level acceptable to YOU & YOUR Family
- Segregate your Passwords
- Educate Your Family, Visitors & “hired help”
- Regularly Conduct a Cyber Self Search
- Ensure that you understand Social Networking rules
- RansomWare – Year 2 question

The more a potential attacker knows about YOU & YOUR family, the easier it is to conduct a successful attack - Abusers are NOT always old

Online Safety – What Can We Do?

- Regular discussion – NOT one off
- Demonstrate & explain potential risks - CEOP
- Not JUST stranger danger – future career!
- Discuss school's online safety & acceptable use policies cyberbullying - radicalism
- Set parental controls gaming/tablets/phones
