<p>Phonics - (Reception children are either on Phase 1, 2 or 3).</p> <p>Please refer to this link https://www.jollylearning.co.uk/resource-bank/learn-the-letter-sounds/ which has got video demonstrations for each sound. It is important that the children are using pure sounds.</p> <p>Please refer to the Speed Reads in your child's Communication Book to focus on the sounds that they have learnt.</p>

Some are free to play without needing to subscribe, e.g. Penalty Shootout (spelling Phase 3 tricky words correctly) and Yes/No Questions.</p>	<p>Literacy – Reading</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To hear and say the initial sound in words. To segment the sounds in simple words and blend them together Use phonic knowledge to decode regular words and read them aloud accurately. To read and understand simple sentences. <p><i>You could get your child(ren) to practise spelling words whilst using these games. When a word is shown, get your child to not look and practise listening to the sounds.</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Use their phonic knowledge to write words in ways which match their spoken sounds (Literacy – Writing) Use a pencil and hold it effectively to form recognisable letters, most of which are correctly formed (Physical Development – Moving and Handling)

Please use the '**Foundation**' tab to access a range of resources across all the areas of the Early Years curriculum. We particularly recommend '**Scrap's Phase 2 Phonics**' and '**Polly's Phase 3 Phonics**' (can be found by clicking **Phonics** under the **Foundation** tab. The activities are broken into sound sets so it allows children to build up sound knowledge steadily and consolidate their learning confidently by using sounds they have already learnt. The phonics sound map shows the progression of sounds in the order we teach them – please also see the link further down this sheet for the order of phase 2 and 3 sounds. We would also recommend the resources under **Physical Development** and **Understanding the World** which have a range of video clips, activities and printable resources to develop the children's knowledge and questioning skills. There is also a range of counting and shape activities and we would particularly suggest looking at **Numbers 0-20** which has a range of counting, ordering and number recognition games.
