This platform is not only used to provide you with weekly observations of what your child has been learning in school, but also feedback on their reading, and weekly memos with bite size information and tips on how to further support learning and development at home. Respect amongst our Community

We are proud of the diverse community within our school. We know that many parents and guardians feel the same way with comments such as, 'a supportive environment which is welcoming and nurturing', 'inclusive atmosphere' and 'actively promoting diversity and understanding' reflected within parent survey feedback.

Our community is diverse in a wide range of ways, and ensuring a respectful environment is our top priority. 'Respect' and 'Kindness' are two of our school values, and young children rely on adults as their role models. Focus On Wellbeing

During our first half term, we have introduced or reminded, all the children about the Zones of Regulation. The Zones help children to categorise their feelings and improve their ability to recognise and communicate how they are feeling in a safe, non-judgmental way. We use them to teach children strategies or tools to help them move across zones.

What can I do to get back into the green zone?

Yoga / sensory toys / Breathing practise (i.e starfish breathing) / Count to ten / Read a book / Squeeze a pillow / Push against the wall











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Governor Update from Mrs Plimsaul, Chair of Governors

I am pleased to welcome Mr To-Sum Chan to the Governing Body as our second Parent Governor. To-Sum is a Systems Engineer and comes with lots of knowledge and experience in Health and Safety. He has already started work with the group of Governors responsible for ensuring the school is a safe environment for all members of the school community.

The feedback from the parent survey carried out last term has now been analysed and one area we are focussing our attention on is how the Governing Body communicates with parents and families about the work we do. We will be sharing more information with you over the next few months through the Governor section of the school website. We will be starting with a brief introduction from each governor outlining their experience and interests with further information about the work of individual Governors, as well as the work of the different committees added over time.

Clare Atkinson is our lead Governor for Finance. and she has started the ball rolling with

'The Finance Governors monitor the schools budget and ensures that monies are spent appropriately to support the children and teachers. We are also responsible for carrying out an annual audit to make sure that all the correct procedures are followed.' The role of the Governors in the area of Finance is more important than ever. The funding the school receives no longer covers the basic requirements to run the school, such as energy, staffing and day-to-day resources, which is now a significant concern.

The Governing Body continues to challenge the authorities to provide appropriate support for Chestnut Lane School, and other schools as this is a County wide issue, to ensure we can maintain our high standards of welfare and education for our children.

Food Working Group Update on School Meals

Thank you to all Reception and Key Stage I parents for completing the food lunch order form for the next half term. This has now been sent over to the Kids Lunch Company.

The Kids Lunch Company website is currently being updated with the new menus for after half term and will be live for **Little Chestnuts Pre-School** parents to order from Saturday 26th October. Please note orders will need to be made by **midday on Friday 1st November.**

The Food Working Group continue to liaise with the Kids Lunch Company, to discuss the provision of hot meals. However, we currently do not have a timeline as to when this will be possible. We will also continue to look at other local providers who may be able to provide hot meals in the future and we will provide further updates over the course of the year.
