- What does the title/cover make you think of?
- What do you think...?
- What might you learn...?
- What do you predict...?
- What do you imagine...?
- What might happen after/next...?
- What does the title/cover make you wonder?
- What could have happened before...?
- How might the information be set out?
- What might the next part be about?

## Inferring

**Decoding** 

Drilling down to find clues for meaning.

Blending sounds to read new words, reading

familiar words 'at a glance' & recognising 'tricky words'.



- What does the word ... tell you?
- What does the part ... tell you?
- What does...make you think about...?
- Why is this character...?
- Why is the setting...?
- What is the mood like? Why/How do you know?
- What does the character think/feel about...? Why/How do you know?
- What does the author want you to think about...?
  Why/How do you know?

## Asking questions

Asking questions to unscrew deeper meaning.

- Who...?
- What...?
- When...?
- Where...?
- I wonder...?
- Why...?
- How...?
- How many...?
- What if ...?
- Why do you think ...?
- How do you think ...?
- How do we know ...?

## **Evaluating**

How does the text measure up?



### Language

- Did you enjoy...? Why/why not?
- Why does the word/phrase... work well?
- Why does the author use...? What does it make you think about...?
- What do you like about the way the author has described/explained...?
- How would you improve...?

### **Organisation**

- Who might find this book useful...?
- Do you think the text/story is organised well? Why?
- Does the presentation help the reader? How?
- How would you change/improve the structure of...?

## **Clarifying** *STOP! Hammer time!*



- What does ... mean?
- Would you like to reread...?
- Are there any parts/words you don't understand/that don't make sense?
- How could you find out the meaning of...?
- What is the opposite of...?
- What could you do to help you understand/work out...?
- Can you think of another word (synonym) that means.../the author could have used instead of...?

# Making connections

I can make links to myself, other texts and my world.

## Text to self:

- Have you ever been to/seen/felt...?
- Do you know anything about...? Why?
- Can you imagine how... is feeling? Why?

### Text to text:

- Have you read any other books like this one before?
- Does this book remind you of any other books you have read? Can you tell me about them?
- Does this part of the story/information remind you of...?
- Have you read any other books like this one before?
  How are they similar/different?
- How is this character similar/different to...?

# Summarising

The shortest tool, so let's keep it short!



- What happened first/then/next/at the end?
- Can you tell me the story/some important information in your own words?
- What are the most important ideas/events/ facts? How do you know?
- Can you tell me about this part...?
- What is the main theme of...?
- Can you summarise this book in 10 words?
- If this was a news story, what would the headline be?

### Text to world:

- What does this book make you think about?
- What important messages is this book giving us?
- What does this book teach us?
- Does this book have a moral?
- How does this book link to...?

### Increasing Level of Challenge
