### **Author Visit**



On 13<sup>th</sup> September we had a successful visit from Sam Copeland author of 'The

Bear Behind'. We were thrilled that our families purchased approximately 135 copies of the book, which were all individually dedicated to Chestnut Lane children and signed by the author. It was great to have lots of parental support, and the in-school story-telling session was very much enjoyed by all the children who took part.

# Holistic Sleep Coach Workshop

Thank you to everyone who attended our first home life workshop, which focussed on sleep. We have attached with

this newsletter some helpful resources from the session. These have also been added to our school website under the Wellbeing tab. We are planning future workshops to support home life, and have taken some great ideas from those who attended, which included nutrition for children, and anxiety in children, in particular separation anxiety. If you have any other areas that you would like support with, please email these to the school office.

### **Baseline Assessments**

We are so pleased with how the children have settled in and are proud of the progress they are making. Teachers are also working hard getting to know individual strengths and areas for development, through the use of carefully planned assessments. Most of these take place through one-toconversations/tasks with the teacher and children are not aware they are being 'assessed', but just given the chance to share their knowledge and understanding. Outcomes of these assessments give detailed, personalised information about each child and inform important links with home learning, such as the reading books and Phonics/Spelling Challenges your child receives. They will also inform discussions at our upcoming Parent Consultations, where you are free to ask your child's teacher any questions.

### Focus on Wellbeing

How is it already October! With colder and darker days approaching we would like to check in and give you some tips for winter wellness.

**Tip I - get out:** Get out in the natural day light, sit near a window, take a walk in the garden or park. When you do go outside, dress appropriately for the weather. You will enjoy being outside if you are warm when it's cold. Being outside will boost your mood and it decreases levels of stress and anxiety.

**Tip 2 - digital detox :** Spend quality time with your loved ones without technology. A digital free hour or day allows for quality interactions that build deeper connections.

**Tip 3 - mindful tidying:** Declutter spaces in your home, listen to music whilst you do any chores. Research shows that having a tidy up is as good as meditating and the end result of a tidy space is mood boosting.

Last Tuesday, 10th, was World Mental Health Day and we discussed this with the children in our assembly. They then took part in a range of well-being activities including: nature walk, tree rubbing, talking about our emotions and meditating.

### **Respecting the School Grounds**

Recently we were hugely disappointed to learn that one of our recently planted young trees in the front field (bottom of the school drive), that we were fortunate to be donated, had been pulled out. Sadly, this is just one example of areas of our school where nature and growing are not being shown the respect that they should be. This is primarily taking place before and after school, when children are under the supervision of their parents and carers.

We would like to remind everyone that all plants, trees and flowers growing within our school grounds should be treated with care. Trees should not be climbed on, pulled, or damaged, and other plants should not be trodden on or picked. We spend a lot of time working with the children to look after our school grounds, and we would ask that outside of the school hours, the same respect is shown by all

### **Parking Concerns**

school, parking on double yellow lines and also blocking driveways, particularly around the roads of Chestnut Close, The Gowers and Hollybush Lane.
