School Challenges

Parents and guardians will have undoubtedly heard through media coverage about the current challenges faced by schools. These include, severe financial constraints, lack of the right support and provision for children with SEND, and staff recruitment and retention due to enormous pressures and spiralling workloads.

Much like other schools, both locally and nationally, our school is not exempt from the impact these challenges have. We are well aware that this presents our whole school community, staff, governors and the parent body, with very real concerns.

Lots of hard work and continued efforts have been put into managing what is in the school's control, and we warmly encourage parents to come and talk to the school if they have worries or concerns, in order to work together towards possible resolutions.

We would like to remind parents that there are a wide range of ways in which you can contact school staff, including:

- approaching class teachers or the headteacher at the school gates/front entrance at drop-off in the morning,
- via communication books and learning logs to reach the class teacher,
- phone calls or emails to the school office to ask to make an appointment to speak with the relevant member of staff (i.e. class teacher, key stage lead/ deputy headteacher, SENCo or headteacher),
- contacting your class rep to share queries or concerns with the school on your behalf.

If you are not sure who to contact, please reach out to the school office who can ensure your message gets to the right person in school.

We all have the shared goal of wanting all children to be happy, and to make progress. We rely on everyone's support as part of this process, and look forward to speaking with members of our school community in the near future.

Road Safety Week

I. Make the most of natural light

There's actually a browser extension you can turn on which will remind you every time you visit a site that makes the donations.

The shop's website is exactly the same and the **prices are exactly the same**. The stores simply give cashback to Easyfundraising for the referral which is then passed on to our charity, CLESA. It's just two extra clicks for you before you shop.
