


#### Tip I - Eat Well

## 1. Sign up to Easyfundraising using <u>this link</u> and download the app.

2. Every time you want to shop simply search for the shop you want to go to on the Easyfundraising app/website (there are over 8,000 of them listed) and click through to shop. There's actually a browser extension you can turn on which will remind you every time you visit a site that makes the donations.

The shop's website is exactly the same and the **prices are exactly the same**. The stores simply give cashback to Easyfundraising for the referral which is then passed on to our charity, CLESA. It's just two extra clicks for you before you shop.
