# Upcoming Events & Workshops

### Children's Mental Health Week – 6<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> February

During this week we will be celebrating Children's Mental Health week. We will be building on our established wellbeing work and engaging the children in several wellbeing sessions.


#### **Cake Sales**
